

The little girl from *Bredasdorp*

On the 26 April 2012, an article appeared in the YOU magazine about a six year old girl, Azariah Slammet from Bredasdorp. Azariah, was born with a rare skin condition called lamellar ichthyosis, or more commonly referred to as 'fish skin' disease, that covers her whole body. Life for this little girl has become very difficult. The skin is constantly dry and causes continuous itching, not to mention the psychological effects, not just for Azariah's, but also for her family.

Azariah's mother, Anecke is currently unemployed and only receives a small grant from the government. Azariah's father does not contribute any maintenance towards the wellbeing and treatment of his daughter. Azariah attends the local school and is fortunately accepted by her peers and has supportive friends.

Lamellar ichthyosis

Lamellar ichthyosis is a rare genetic disease diagnosed in approximately 1: 300 000 births and is not contagious. At birth the infant has a 'cling film' like skin which is eventually shed after about ten to fourteen days with the appearance underneath of fish scale- like skin. Before the shedding of the skin, there is always a possibility of bacterial infection due to debris and moisture that accumulates under the skin scales. This may also result in an unpleasant body odour. Currently, the only treatments available for this condition are medications such as oral and systemic retinoids and emollients containing urea and other alphas hydroxy acids to alleviate some of the symptoms such as tightness of the skin. This tightness can cause the hands to burst open as in Azariah's case. The systemic medication comes with side-effects and regular blood tests are needed to monitor the side-effects of the medication. The scales on her skin fall off but soon new scales appear. So far there is not really much to alleviate the debilitating symptoms of this condition. To date, there is no known cure for Lamellar ichthyosis, only medication

to assist in the alleviation of various symptoms.

Associated symptoms

This condition may not be lifethreatening but occurs with numerous problems, such as hyperkeratosis. This interferes with normal perspiration and can cause overheating or heat stroke, so staying cool is of prime importance. Perspiration is a natural process which takes place in order to cool the body and this is absent in Azariah's condition. Ectropion, or abnormal outward turning of the eyelids which subjects the cornea to constant exposure, may cause tearing and keratization of the cornea which may cause loss of vision. In this situation the eyes should constantly be lubricated. The toe and finger digits also become inflexible due to very taut skin, limited mobility and tearing of the skin could result, which of course gives rise to even more issues.
